Sharing the Jesus Life

Today, I am humbled by God's grace, faithful love of Karen, family, friends and answered prayers. "For all that you have done I will thank you . . ." "If it were not for the Lord who was on our side . . ." "My heart, my mind, my body, my soul, Lord, take control."

These songs mean so much more than one year ago, December 15. It is the anniversary of Karen taking me to the ER in great pain—stomach, back and chest. Fortunately, it was not my heart. But they did not know what was wrong. Karen thought I would be in the hospital a few days and come home. We had no idea of the journey ahead. By Christmas, family gathered with great anxiety being told by doctors that I was critical. I was out of it and didn't know anything—a total systemic shut down. Docs gave me a 20% chance of living. I was put on ECMO (extracorporeal membrane oxygenation)—the ultimate life support for over two weeks. At one time, family counted sixteen lines/IV's/tubes and three machines going into my body.

Every day was a roller coaster with total time in three hospitals of five months ten days (Dec 15-May 25). Karen was a warrior through it all and put over 5,000 miles on her car back and forth to hospitals while keeping home going and being a medical advocate. I am grateful for all the doctors, nurses and care to keep me alive and the arduous journey of healing. I am seventy-five pounds down (not a recommended weight loss program) punctuated by lots of PT, OT, home health and wound care. Through it all, my family was always present along with the outpouring of cards, texts, calls, visits and resources. We are blessed and I have come so far realizing there is so much I don't remember, thankfully. Moving forward For several weeks, I have been walking and driving myself to dialysis. I have a new set of friends and ministry at the dialysis center. I am getting stronger; wounds are healing, and I am waiting to get on a kidney transplant list at Methodist Dallas. The transplant team says the best-case scenario is for me to have a live donor. Prayers appreciated. I am returning to HOPE Network The HN Board of Directors shepherded everything in a way that provided me, in essence, family medical leave for one year to heal.

Beth Hadley and I will co-lead HN beginning in January. My travel schedule will undoubtedly be limited, necessitating creativity with mentoring, coaching, and consulting.

I know I am different because of this experience, and I want to use it to bless others. I continue to ponder this reality and adjust in how I do ministry. I am ready to dive back into HOPE Network, and we are so incredibly grateful for God's faithfulness and healing. 

Readings Psalm 25:1-10, Nehemiah 9:16-25; 1 Thessalonians 5:12-22

Psalm 25:1-10 (NRSV) 1 To you, O LORD, I lift up my soul. 2 O my God, in you I trust; do not let me be put to shame; do not let my enemies exult over me. 3 Do not let those who wait for you be put to shame; let them be ashamed who are wantonly treacherous. 4 Make me to know your ways, O LORD; teach me your paths. 5 Lead me in your truth, and teach me, for you are the God of my salvation; for you I wait all day long. 6 Be mindful of your mercy, O LORD, and of your steadfast love, for they have been from of old. 7 Do not remember the sins of my youth or my transgressions; according to your steadfast love remember me, for your goodness sake, O LORD! 8 Good and upright is the LORD; therefore he instructs sinners in the way. 9 He leads the humble in what is right, and teaches the humble his way. 10 All the paths of the LORD are steadfast love and faithfulness, for those who keep his covenant and his decrees.

The Psalmist, David, writes of his trust in the Lord, his Savior, in Psalm 25:1-10. He contrasts his way of rebellion and sin (v. 7) with the way of God (vs. 4,8,9,10) that leads to hope (vs. 3,5). His prayer is that God will remember him in the Lord's love, mercy and faithfulness (v. 6,7,10), and not remember him by the sins of his youth (v.7)

Ezra preaches to the returning remnant in Jerusalem in Nehemiah 9:16-25 with the encouragement to remember that the Israelites in the wilderness rebelled against God in making and worshiping a golden calf, and yet, God did not abandon them for God was a "forgiving God, gracious and compassionate, slow to anger and abounding in love" (v. 18).

Paul, likewise, reminds Christians to remember the blessings of God as we journey toward our promise land. "Be joyful always; pray continually; give thanks in all circumstances, for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus." (1 Thes. 5:16-18)

After enduring through all your difficulties,
And giving thanks for God's deliverance;
After counting the joy of all your blessings,
And giving thanks for God's abundance;
After regretting the pain of all your mistakes,
And giving thanks for God's forgiveness;
After remembering all your anxious dread,
And giving thanks for God's eternal hope;
Remember that your gracious God,
loves you more than you love yourself.
