

The Good News

Luke 9:1-6 (ESV) And he called the twelve together and gave them power and authority over all demons and to cure diseases, and he sent them out to proclaim the kingdom of God and to heal. And he said to them, "Take nothing for your journey, no staff, nor bag, nor bread, nor money; and do not have two tunics. And whatever house you enter, stay there, and from there depart. And wherever they do not receive you, when you leave that town shake off the dust from your feet as a testimony against them." And they departed and went through the villages, preaching the gospel and healing everywhere.

Christmas is a time for sharing joy and good news. The Gospel, the euangelion in Greek, was the term used in the New Testament, meaning "glad tidings." You can easily see from this word comes our English word "evangelize," which is often used to describe church mission work, or the sharing about Jesus with non-Christians. The Christmas season is a great time to practice "evangelism," and to remind ourselves, in the process, that it really should be Good News from God that we share.

Although the season of Advent is just a four-week period focused on the coming of Jesus into the world as a baby to be our Savior and King, and to remind us that our Lord will come again, it would be beneficial for us to also remember that the "Good News Gospel" started a long time ago.

The "Good News Gospel" began in the Garden of Eden as God dealt with Adam and Eve's sin with the hope that someday another woman's child would defeat Satan and Sin's Curse. The Good News was in the prophecy to Abraham that his seed would bless all nations. It was part of Moses message that a prophet like him would one day deliver God's people again with greater authority than his. The Gospel message was in the promise to King David that one of his descendants would be seated upon his throne to reign over all forever! And the "Good News Gospel" was in Isaiah's message of a Savior and Messianic Kingdom that would bring hope to the oppressed and downtrodden, and freedom to those enslaved to sin. And although separated by many years, the prophet Malachi joined Isaiah in sharing the Good News of a Messenger who would go before the Messiah and prepare the way for the King and the new Kingdom by preaching repentance.

And then on that glorious night of Jesus' entrance into the world, the angels of God proclaimed the Good News to the shepherds in the fields, and they shared it as far as they could travel. Then the day came for the Messiah to begin His ministry with the simple clear message, the "Good News Gospel" message, "the Kingdom of God is near." Even after His death and resurrection and before His ascension back to the Father, His commission for His Apostles was a call to proclaim the Good News all over the world. And now it is our commission in this season of joy and hope, to not waste a moment sharing anything less than that which is Good Newsworthy, the Gospel that a Savior has come, Jesus Christ the Lord, the Son of God!
