2005 Goal Areas

2025 is a year to renew our commitment to the Lord's Mission for our Church. God's eternal plan for all of us is that we be conformed to the image of His Son (Rom. 8:29). This Christ-like objective is called discipleship because it parallels the Great Commission of Jesus in Mat. 20:18-20. Individually, and as a church, we should do everything we can to become more like Christ. We have summarized this church mission in 3 words: Rooted, Growing, Reaching. As Disciples of Christ we should be rooted in the Word, Jesus Christ the Logos (Word) of God and Scripture (the word of God). We should be Growing to be like Jesus following his example and teaching and bearing the fruit of the Holy Spirit. And we should be Reaching out to others in loving service to share the Good News of God's Love through Jesus so they too can become a disciple of Christ.

Based on this broad goal for our Church Family, we have focused on 12 Goal Areas for 2025 that can help us renew this commitment to Discipleship. I will work through each goal area to develop its application to discipleship.

1. Preach and Teach on "Reaching,"

In the last three years I have focused on "Rooted" and "Growing," it is time for us to think more about "Reaching." How can we make disciples? Churches struggle with this, and one reason is not understanding the meaning of discipleship and thinking in terms of a distorted view of evangelism. To some people evangelism is door knocking, cold calls, selling the church to strangers, passing out tracks and religious literature, calling people sinners in need of repentance, altar calls, and endless verses of "Just As I Am". Evangelism is "goodnewsing," not really a word, but it is announcing the good news! Making Disciples includes sharing the good news of our Savior, but that's not trying to convert someone to your church based on your salesmanship tactics. Discipleship models Christ in reaching out to others in loving service to help them find the fulfilling life of being a disciple of Christ, a Disciple that is Rooted, Growing and Reaching. Well, how do you do that? You ask. By being a disciple yourself who is like Jesus, treating others with love and respect, being gentle and kind and serving their needs, answering their questions about God in practical scriptural ways, and showing them the power of the Holy Spirit in your everyday walk with them. As others see Christ in you, and they hear His words applying to their needs, they will want more, they will want to be His disciples willing to commit in baptism to a death and burial of the old life of sin and raised to walk in newness of a life empowered by the Holy Spirit.

What Now? Think Like A Missionary!

In 1990 I was a 35-year-old preacher in a small community of 15,000 at the edge of DFW. The congregation of 250 had a rich 100 year plus history. By church standards we were a medium size church. Now the community is 70,000+ and a church of 300 is, in many ways, a large church post-Covid. As a young preacher I was reading everything I could on helping a church grow (as if it were up to me). Then I read this.

"The day of the professional minister is over. The day of the missionary pastor has come. These are words of gentle confirmation, not striking prophecy. A few who read these words of quiet declaration will say they are startled. They are caught up in a futile romantic longing for a churched culture. Some may protests—and wonder aloud—if this is startling, bold prophecy will come true. I can assure you that it will not come true in the future—because it has already happened." (Kennon L. Callahan. Effective Church Leadership, Harper and Row. 1990).

Callahan was right. When I read his book, it confirmed what I was feeling 34 years ago. A gnawing feeling that us "church folk" lacked a missionary mindset. My training as a "professional minister" was good for caring and feeding the church but left space for engaging God's mission. At that time, the "come to us approach" coupled with good programs was sustainable with some success. According to Gallup, 68% of Americans belonged to a church, synagogue, or mosque. In 2020, 47%, and as of 2024, 42%. It is mainly because of those who are now religiously unaffiliated (RU). Many of whom, however, still believe in Jesus.

Think about people who are no longer affiliated with church. You can name several, can't

you? There are a multitude of factors, but it does not mean they have given up on Jesus. Pray for them by name. Seek opportunities to reach out with a non-judgmental spirit to listen. People need caring relationships not religious pontifications. The core issue is one of trust. Rebuilding trust is about one conversation and confession at a time bathed in honesty and patience. Much more can be said about engaging those who have are not longer present in our version and expectations of church. McKnight and Phillips explore it in detail with candor, wisdom and warnings for the church. Read it if you are only ready to listen, learn and repent. And more specifically, people who have left the church—friends and family. (continued at the top of the next column)

So, what is a congregation to do? It begins with you! Before settling into a pew hoping things will get better, here are a few things to do.

- 1. Pray for a mission spirit in yourself and specific friends.
- 2. Think and reflect on the mission of God. (See We Are On a Mission from God by Dan Bouchelle, President of Missions Resource Network)
- 3. Gather a few friends in your home to begin praying for people.
- 4. Reach out to someone you know who has left church and listen. No lecturing, defending, or rationalizing. Just listen with an open heart.
- 5. Be grounded in the gospels focus on the life and ministry of Jesus. (See John Mark Comer's Practicing the Way: Be with Jesus, Become Like Him, Do as he did. (Waterbrook, 2024).

Finally, at least for now—be committed to moving from I to We.


